Supported Entry Show Guidelines – Application Due by: Feb 28, 2016

To promote and increase Oberhasli entries at ADGA and AGS shows, the Oberhasli Goat club offers the show giving club the advantage of having a supported entry show. There is a difference between a SPECIALTY show and a SUPPORTED ENTRY show...

1) A specialty show is a separately sanctioned show for one breed only, and per ADGA rules, a specialty cannot be held during a regularly sanctioned show. When applying to ADGA for sanctioning, the specialty show must be on a separate application and pay full sanction fee.

2) A supported entry show is where an individual or group sponsors one breed of a regular all breed ADGA show. When applying to ADGA for sanctioning of breeds, any additional non regular classes for the supported entry breed would be listed in the Show Rules and submitted with the sanctioning application.

The Oberhasli Goat Club (OGC) will approve one host show per state / per year for the Oberhasli classes at a regular all breed show to be a supported entry show.

Application Requirements:

1. Prior to applying for sanctioning with ADGA/AGS, the show chairperson or show secretary must receive approval from the OGC, by submitting the attached application. Applications will be approved on a first come, first serve basis; and only one application per state will be approved. Approved shows must include in the Show Rules to be submitted to ADGA/AGS this statement "The Oberhasli classes in Ring ___ are sponsored by the Oberhasli Goat Club. Additional awards for Oberhasli winners will be provided by the Oberhasli Goat Club."
2. The host show must have had the minimum Oberhasli entries to meet the requirements for official sanctioning in at least one of the previous two year's shows. (Exception will be made for a show that has commitments from exhibitors that the show will have enough Oberhasli entries to make official sanction).
3. The host show must sanction Oberhasli as a separate breed, and sanction Senior Does and Junior Does separately. Bucks are optional; if the show is sanctioning Oberhasli bucks separately, then Bucks will be included in the supported show package.
4. In addition to the regular Senior Doe and Junior Doe classes, the host show must offer a Champion Challenge class; and have a minimum of two group classes for Senior Does and for Junior Does. If Bucks are included, there must be a minimum of one group class for Bucks. Group classes may consist of any of the following:

SENIOR DOES

Dam and Daughter
Produce of Dam
Get of Sire
Breeder's Trio
Best Three Females
Dam, Daughter, Granddaughter
Dairy Herd
Best Udder

JUNIOR DOES

Produce of Dam
Get of Sire
Breeder's Trio
Best Three Females

BUCKS

Sire and Son
Get of Sire

5. The host show chairperson or show secretary must submit to the OGC a list of Oberhasli class winners to include the class placing; name of the goat; registration number; and owner's name. A copy of the ring steward's report is preferred. The report should be submitted to OGC within sixty (60) days after the show.
6. Photographs of the at least the Grand Ch, Reserve Ch and BOB are requested, however not required. Host clubs providing photographs of the winners will receive preference for future supported entry show or regional specialty show applications.

Approved Supported Entry Shows will receive:

1. The OGC will reimburse the host club/organization \$20 for sanctioning Oberhasli separately. (\$25 if Bucks are also sanctioned.) Funds will be sent to the show secretary (or designate) upon receipt of confirmation that the show has been approved by ADGA/AGS.
2. The OGC will provide Grand Champion, Reserve Champion, and Best of Breed rosettes for Senior Doe; Junior Doe; and Bucks (if included). These are in addition to the regular breed rosettes you will receive from ADGA.
3. Certificates for the first place in each class; for group classes; and a Certificate of Appreciation for the judge will be sent to the show secretary at least two (2) weeks prior to the date of the show. (A copy of the Show Rules with a list of classes offered must be submitted to OGC as soon as possible for the certificates to be completed and mailed in a timely manner).
4. The OGC will advertise the supported entry show on its website; Facebook page; and newsletter. Show win report and photographs of winners will be published in the newsletter, and on the website.
